Instructions for Making






two (2) 6 x 6-inch fabric pieces two (2) 5 x 6-inch fabric pieces

What to do next:

- 1. Stack or pin the two (2) 5 X 6-inch fabric pieces on top of each other, wrong side (by this we mean the less finished side) together.
- 2. Fold each 6 X 6-inch piece in half, wrong side together, creating two folded (2) 6 X 3-inch pieces.
- 3. Match the raw edges of one folded piece to one edge of the 5 X 6 stacked fabrics, match the second folded piece to the opposite edge of the 5 X 6 stacked fabrics. The folded edges will overlap in the middle.
- 4. Sew or serge all four (4) sides of the stacked fabric, using a 1/4" seam.
- 5. Optional: trim corners a small amount.
- 6. Turn bags right side out.
- 7. Stuff with 3 pads and 2 liners and mail to us! We also accept unstuffed bags, of course.
- 8. Our mailing address is on the back of this sheet. (We gladly accept product donations too.)

What Happens Next



The Kwek Society adds a card to each bag we receive.

The card quotes a portion of Indigenous poet Joy Harjo's poem, *Remember ("Remember the sky that you were born under. Know each of the star's stories. Remember the moon. Know who she is.")*. The poem celebrates life and the connectedness of all earth's inhabitants; our card communicates that moon times (periods) should be celebrated, too! The card also contains a QR code that sends students to the education portions of our website, https://kweksociety.org/learn/.

- When school starts, we distribute the bags and bulk products (pads, liners, tampons, underwear), and puberty education books when requested -- to schools and organizations serving US Indigenous students and their peers.
- We ask our school and organization contacts to share the bags with students as a reusable gift from community members to let them know they are part of our community and we are excited to celebrate moon times together. Our partners can request additional bags and products throughout the school year.
